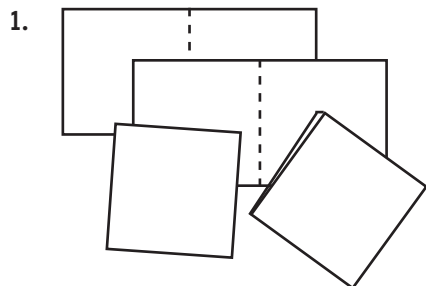
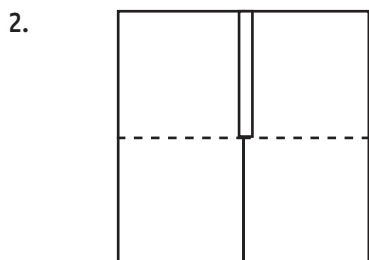


# How To Make a Pop Up Gallery

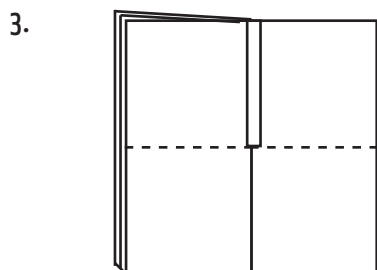
**Materials:** sturdy paper like poster board, scissors, ruler, pencil, tape, glue



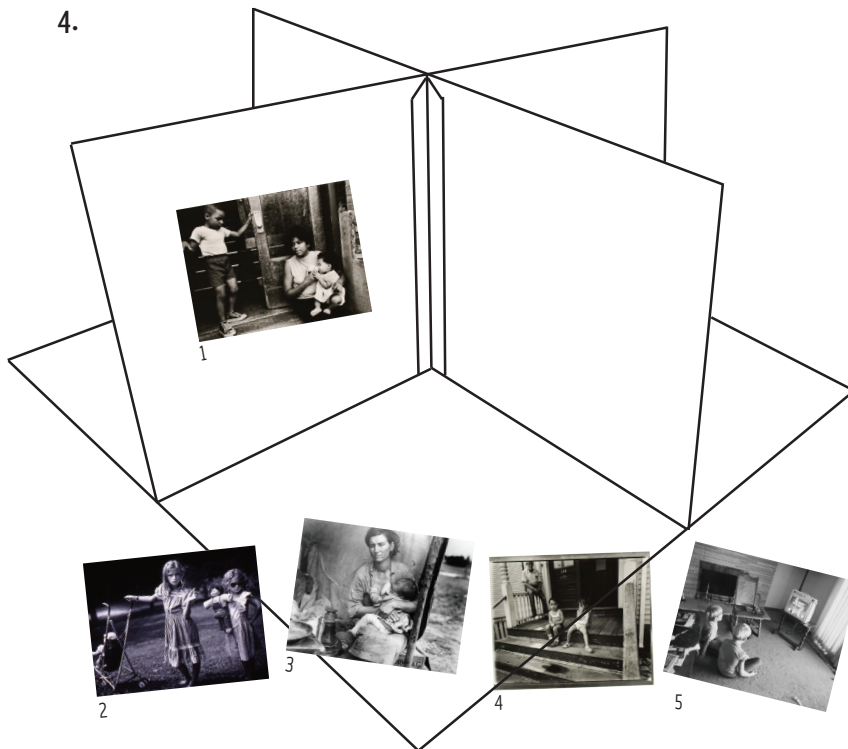
Cut four rectangles and fold each piece in half. The width should be double the height so when they are folded, each piece makes a square.



Open two pieces and lay them flat and side by side. Tape the top halves of the two pieces together.



Close the first two pieces so that they overlap. Add another flat piece and lay them side by side. Tape the top of two halves together. Repeat until all pieces are taped together.



Create four "galleries" by opening the taped pieces and folding out the bottom pieces to create floors. Curate and glue in your miniature art!
